

# Media Library Brief




- Make images easily accessible to UNHCR staff and the press




## Metadata - how we started



- No previous web based system
- Photographers used to sending IPTC data
- Requirement to cover photo, video and text
- Recognition of importance of standards
- Time and resource



- Improve search


### The Master Sheet



A trip into purgatory created by conflict. Nikolai Medvedev is going to the cellar which is his home, and home to 17 others on Kozareva street in southern Donetsk. He and his mother moved here in July when the shelling became too intense. She was terrified and then paralyzed, literally, by fear in the dark. In December, she died.

### Who does what?



- Photographers upload images with specified IPTC fields
- Description and background data edited and data checked office
- Incoming IPTC data visible to check source data
- Use a script and value lists to standardise data where possible

#### Issues

- Copying of text with formatting and non standard characters must be avoided
- Standardising common data across departments will be important



# Keywording

- We have merged UNHCR specific terms with KT Thesaurus
- Keywording pilot will be underway soon
- Search should be much improved .......

- Takes time to get right but well worth it
- Photographers pleased to see their images well displayed with useful data
- More and more people are using the site
